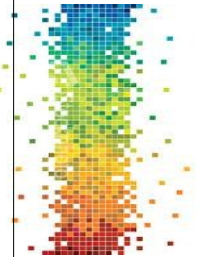

About Our Presenter

The Rev. Dr. Neal D. Presa serves as pastor of Middlesex Presbyterian Church, and as an adjunct faculty member at New Brunswick Theological Seminary where he teaches courses in preaching.

Dr. Presa is currently a candidate for Moderator of the 220th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) He has served on the executive committees of the World Alliance of Reformed Churches and the World Communion of Reformed Churches. His publications are in the areas of liturgical theology, ecumenism, pastoral theology and preaching.

Dr. Presa is this year's recipient of the seminary's Poppen/Young Fellowship for original research in the field of reformed worship, awarded to persons whose scholarly work promises to increase the vitality of the worshipping church.
