Course Description

This 7 week course offers a historical, cultural, biblical and social overview of consumer debt in Western society. Students will explore the relationship between Christian faith, clergy and consumerism; specifically, the impact of debt on clergy and congregational ministry. Methods of assessing, addressing and avoiding high levels of personal debt will be developed. Consideration will be given to the implications of the prosperity Gospel theology and movement on mainline churches and clergy. Models for financial health among professional clergy will be designed.

This course also includes financial & spiritual coaching for seminarians. Students who successfully complete the requirements of the course, will be provided one-on-one coaching (approximately five sessions) with a spiritual coach who has special training in working with finances. Coaching sessions will examine approaches to handling debt, comprehensively look at consumer debt (car loans, mortgages, credit cards), as well as education loans as part of each person's total financial health.

This course is open to all Master's level students and alumni/ae. Registration deadline March 12, 2015.
