Guide for Finding Textbooks

Buying or renting used textbooks can be cost-effective and easy! Add to your personal library and keep reference materials on hand even when they aren't available digitally or at the library.

Use the ISBN to search for the book online.

This ensures that you have the correct editions, but it is still good to double check.



Begin with a general Google search of the ISBN or try your local library catalogs. Sometimes books are available for free from other sources!

Tips and Tricks:

- Compare textbooks from multiple vendors for the best price.
- Older editions are always cheaper. Ask your professor if an older edition will suffice.
- Use the rental option when available as this is always cheaper. They are usually in good condition and you are still able to take notes in them.
