## CERTIFICATE PROGRAM 2020-2021 COURSE SCHEDULE

### CERTIFICATE IN THEOLOGICAL STUDIES ON-LINE

#### CT102 - Church History (Fall 2020)

This course will survey the history of Christianity from the end of the Apostolic age to the present, with attention to major themes, persons and events in history of Christian life, thought and institutions.

#### CT109 - Church Leadership and Administration (Fall 2020)

In this course students will gain an understanding of church leadership and administration in a changing world as a process of self reflection, systemic examination, and sustained action. This course will look at the ways in which the church requires management as well as leadership and how those things differ and work together for successful congregational ministry. (Note: This class replaces "Servant Leadership." Students who have already taken "Servant Leadership" are not required to take this course)

#### CT107 - Christian Ethics (Spring 2021)

The goal of the class is to understand the nature and characteristics of contemporary Christian moral discernment.

#### CT104 - Servant Formation (Spring 2021)

This course is designed to provide students with opportunities to reflect their identities as persons called to serve in ministry. Students will be assisted to cultivate a disciplined spiritual and intellectual life, and to explore theological topics foundation to the practice of ministry.

### CERTIFICATE IN CHURCH LEADERSHIP (ONLINE)

#### CT101 - Old Testament (Fall 2020)

A study of the historical, cultural, and literary contexts and an introduction to the theological themes in the writings of the Old Testament.

#### CT109 - Church Leadership and Administration (Fall 2020)

In this course students will gain an understanding of church leadership and administration in a changing world as a process of self reflection, systemic examination, and sustained action. This course will look at the ways in which the church requires management as well as leadership and how those things differ and work together for successful congregational ministry. #### CT103 - New Testament (Spring 2021)

#### CT110 - Introduction to Pastoral Care (Spring 2021)

This course will introduce the student to the regiments of pastoral care and counseling equipping them with requisite skills to address those who are in crisis, emotionally, psychologically, and spiritually. It will emphasize the pastoral functions of guiding, reconciling, healing, sustaining, presence and empowerment. |
